SAFEGUARDING AND CHILD PROTECTION

Because of our day-to day contact with the children we are particularly well placed to observe outward signs of abuse, changes in behaviour or failure to develop. We have a duty to protect children from abuse; however, our role is in recognition and referral, not investigation or intervention. We are required by law to follow procedures laid down by the Norfolk Safeguarding Children Board if we see signs which suggest that one of our pupils may have been the victim of abuse. Use of the procedures in this way is an obligation placed on the school by legislation and in no way infers that any parent/carer is being accused of wrong-doing.


One of the recommendations from our safeguarding audit earlier this year was to be mindful of the fact that some parents are coming into school before 9 or after 3 via the side doors rather than through the front door. From now on, please come to the front so that we know who is in school – this is for everyone's safety and I am sure you will agree it is a good move.

WELL DONE EVERYONE

Over the year our children have been out on trips such as Pizza Express, Time and Tide and Catton Park and we have also had workshops and visitors in school such as Mad Science, our Ofsted inspector and a group of musicians. Our children are always commended on their behaviour both in and out of school and they deserve a pat on the back for that!

All of our Y2 children have also worked really hard throughout May when they had to do tests in reading and maths – they were challenging this year and they all had a really good go at completing them to the best of their ability so well done Y2.

Next week all of our Y1 children will have to do a Phonics Check so we hope they rise to the challenge of this and get the high results that they deserve.

Y2 ENRICHMENT

As stated in the last newsletter, all Y2 children will be doing an enrichment activity and individual letters will be sent out at different times according to when the activities are.
